DISCOVERING PATHWAYS

Exploring Northeastern Career Opportunities

November 8 and 9, 2017

A total of 74 educators and industry representatives from across the region attended the Discovering Pathways forum on November 8 and 9 to discuss local labour market needs as well as employers' expectations and requirements. Feedback both from education and industry participants was positive with many suggesting that events of this nature be held more often.

During the last part of the day, participants were divided into groups to discuss strategies and resources that are currently available to: understand the local labour market needs, to build relationships with employers, and to expose students to workplace experiential learning opportunities. They were further encouraged to discuss and suggest how to build on what is working well with the existing strategies and resources, and also how to address what is not working so well. The results of that exercise will be shared with the Far Northeast LEPC Education Working Group in order to identify future initiatives to continue to improve collaboration between education and industry.

BUSINESS AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS WORKING TOGETHER TO PLAN FOR A QUALIFIED WORKFORCE FOR THE MINING SECTOR

The Far Northeast Training Board (FNETB) is working collaboratively with business and community organizations to produce a mining sector employment and hiring forecast report to better understand the projected mining sector labour force needs (shortages or surplus). The objective is to ensure that timely and effective workforce development and labour adjustment strategies are developed.

Several stakeholders gathered at The Bucket Shop for a press conference to mark the official kick-off of the project. The report is expected to be released at the end of February.
